Job Trainer Funding Eligibility (<u>This does not apply to Existing Worker Funding</u>) There are limited funded places available

Enrolling in this qualification and availing the relevant state funding, may affect student's future training options and the eligibility for further government subsidised training.

To be eligible for the funding:

- You must be a Tasmanian Resident (a Tasmanian resident is defined as a permanent resident of Australia living in Tasmania for a minimum of six (6) months)
- You must be aged 16 years or older

Further to this, to be eligible for the funding, you must be defined as a job trainer. A job trainer is someone who is:

- Not a school student as defined by Sections 3 and 4 of the Education Act 1994;
- Out of work Unemployed. OR
- In receipt of income support payments; OR
- A person currently employed who would prefer, and is available for, more hours of work than they currently have, including part time workers; OR
- Is a school leavers and a young person aged 17 to 24, REGARDLESS OF THEIR EMPLOYMENT STATUS

Existing Worker Funding Eligibility (<u>This does not apply to Job Trainer Funding</u>)

There are limited funded places available

Enrolling in this qualification and availing the relevant state funding, may affect student's future training options and the eligibility for further government subsidised training.

To be eligible for the funding:

- You must be a Tasmanian Resident (a Tasmanian resident is defined as a permanent resident of Australia living in Tasmania for a minimum of six (6) months)
- You must be aged 15 years or older

Further to this, to be eligible for this funding, you must have been nominated by your current

Aged Care employer.
