

## Specific entry requirements for students applying for the Diploma of Nursing course

There are specific entry requirements to enrol into the Diploma of Nursing qualification.

HERC are required to gather evidence of the applicant's ability to demonstrate suitable levels of English proficiency. This is to satisfy the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) English language skills registration standard which is required for eligibility to commence in the program of study.

### Applicant English Language Skills Entry Requirements

Applicants wishing to enrol into the Diploma of Nursing at ANMEC/HERC must be able to demonstrate English Language Competency prior to entry to the program of study. This is to comply with registration requirements with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency and the Nursing & Midwifery Board of Australia.

There are 2 entry pathways to choose from for demonstration of the registration standards for Enrolled Nursing, that are required for enrolment into our course.

You will be required to provide evidence and details in relation to the selections below and evidence of any primary, secondary education, as well as sit and pass a Language Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) entrance test at ANMEC/HERC.

#### 1. Primary language pathway

English is your primary language and you have undertaken and satisfactorily completed, at least six years of primary and secondary education taught and assessed solely in English, (see list of recognised countries below) including at least two years between years 7 and 12.

## 2. English language test pathway

You have achieved the required minimum scores in one of the approved English language tests and meet the requirements for test results specified in the NMBA's English language skills registration standard.

Explanation of test options and requirements:

- IELTS
- OET
- TOEFL
- PTE academic

The **IELTS** (academic module) with a minimum overall **score of 7** and a minimum score of 7 in each of the four components (listening, reading, writing & speaking, and no score in any component of the test is below 6.5).

**OET** (Occupational English Test) with a minimum **score of B** in each of the four components (listening, reading, writing and speaking and no score in any component of the test is below C).

**TOEFL iBT** (Test of English as a Foreign Language Internet based test) with a minimum total **score of 94** in each section of the test. (24 for listening, 24 for reading, 27 for writing, and, 23 for speaking and no score in any of the sections is below: 20 for listening, 19 for reading, 24 for writing, and 20 for speaking).

**PTE** (Pearson Test of English) with a minimum overall **score of 65** in each of the four communicative skills (listening, reading, writing and speaking, and no score in any of the communicative skills is below 58)

To be eligible for enrolment into the Diploma of Nursing program, the evidence provided must be achieved in 1 sitting, **or** a maximum of 2 test sittings in a six-month period, achieving the minimum scores as named.

## What to provide to HERC for Enrolment?

On application you must view the information supplied on the HERC website and make the determination of which pathway is applicable to your situation. You can select which pathway suits your situation and supply the relevant documentation as evidence to support your application for entry into the course.
